SPRING CLEANUP IS COMING

It's that time again: Time to put out unwanted furniture, appliances, and household goods for the free Spring Cleanup.

From **March 24 through April 4**, solid waste crews will pick up large items without the usual extra charge. The cleanup includes large brush, branches, and tree trimmings up to ten feet in length and three feet in diameter.

Spring cleanup collection will occur on normal pickup days in Stonewood (Tuesdays and Fridays). Yard waste collection continues on Wednesdays, as usual.

A few "don'ts": The city will NOT collect electronics, tires, propane tanks, paint, motor oil, pesticides, herbicides, pool chemicals, or other hazardous household waste.

All pickup materials need to be placed between the curb and the sidewalk before 7 a.m. on a regular collection day. Please keep items away from light poles, mailboxes, and trees.

This is the only community cleanup scheduled for 2025; let's make the most of it!

ART IN ALTAMONTE

SUNPASS OR SCAM?

With the debut of "dynamic pricing" on local toll roads, some motorists may be overpaying because of bogus bills – frequently delivered in text messages.

State authorities have shut down hundreds of websites used in fake toll notices. The alerts sent to drivers are an attempt to steal identification and financial information, according to officials.

"Floridians need to be cautious when receiving texts or emails claiming they owe money for tolls as it could be a scam," said acting Attorney General John Guard. "These fraudulent SunPass websites preyed on unsuspecting Floridians and tourists, trying to steal personal information through fake billing notices."

Authorities warn that messages threatening penalties if immediate payment is not made are probably a scam. Officials suggest checking your account by going directly to the SunPass or E-Z Pass website, NOT by clicking links in an email or text.

DOOR-TO-DOOR CAUTION

Spring is the season for solicitors to sell roofing services, tree trimming, and the like, door-to-door. You already may have encountered these surprise salespeople who "just happen to be in the area."

Be aware that Altamonte Springs city code requires nearly all solicitors to register with the city and to carry proper credentials – even when collecting for charity.

Also, most charitable solicitors must carry permits showing the name of their organization and the starting and ending dates of their solicitation. Commercial representatives must show a copy of a city permit on request.

TIMELY TAX TIPS

With the deadline for filing income tax returns looming on April 15, Florida taxpayers may qualify in this year's IRS Direct File program.

This free filing software is accessible on a computer, table, or phone. It includes a "direct import" feature, which allows taxpayers to get identification and W-2 information directly from IRS data. Taxpayers can check their eligibility for the program via online chat.

IRS Free File electronic filing also remains available this year. "Almost everyone" is eligible to file a return for free, according to the IRS, using software from eight companies that partnered with the agency.

You can create an online account at the IRS to see your payment history, scheduled or pending payments, and other tax details. You also can use this account to pay your tax bill or make estimated tax payments. To create or access your account, go to:
